Program Philosophy

We believe preschool children learn best in a child-centered environment that provides developmentally appropriate learning experiences. Each child's diverse and changing needs are best addressed using a team approach.

Families are an integral part of the educational process and we encourage them to be active participants.

Program Description

Our classrooms are multi-aged and balanced with respect to diversity of the community's populations. Classroom programs and staffing are planned each year in response to the individualized needs of the children. The curriculum is planned to fulfill goals and objectives for preschool children in their social, emotional, cognitive language, and physical development. We have planned a learning environment that is:

- Safe
- Child-centered
- Success oriented
- Developmentally appropriate
- Educationally challenging
- Integrated with respect to educational needs
- Play based

Our educational approach is characterized by:

- A developmental perspective which views learning as a lifelong process
- Ongoing assessment of performance to inform the instructional plan
- Flexible teaching and intervention approaches
- The ability to respond to the changing needs of children and families

The consultative team plans for every child. Some children receive additional direct services according to their educational plan. Parent partnerships are critical to student success. This partnership is supported by:

- Ongoing parent-teacher communication
- Family activities
- Parent-teacher conferences
- School volunteering

What Is An Integrated Program? An integrated program recognizes the strengths and needs of the whole student, including the physical, social, and academic, giving equal consideration to each in the development of program options. Children with special needs who may require services in addition to those planned for all children are embraced as integral members of the classroom.

Classroom Routines A variety of learning activities are planned each day for the children. Classroom routines are designed to assist children in becoming independent and competent. Each classroom follows its own schedule, based on the needs of the children enrolled. Classrooms include the following components:

Group Meeting Time: Children learn to take turns, to participate in-group discussions, to follow and anticipate daily routines. Choices: Each classroom is organized into learning centers, which provide a variety of focused activities. Children learn to make choices and explore their own interests to build independence, cognition, language and social skills. Snack or Lunch: Eating together provides a valuable social experience for preschool children, as well as an opportunity to work on personal care issues such as managing personal belongings, hand washing, table manners, nutrition and eating skills. Gross Motor/Outdoor Time: Young children love to move! Outdoor play allows children to vigorously move their whole body, which facilitates gross motor skill development and coordination. When outdoor play is not possible, we have access to the school gym. Story Time: Reading is vital to children's school success. Early literacy experiences take place in each classroom through reading, writing, and oral language activities. Closing: Each classroom utilizes its own routine to bring closure to the day.

Curriculum The Early Steps Preschool follows specific curriculum to expose children to a variety of math, literacy, and social skills. These curricula are aligned with the Massachusetts Guidelines for Preschool Learning Experiences. Opening the World to Learning: OWL is a comprehensive curriculum that covers all domains of early learning. The content of each unit is built around a carefully crafted daily routine within an activity- center day. Themes, skills, and concepts are developed through quality children's fiction and nonfiction trade books. Building Blocks: This mathematics curriculum is designed to develop preschooler's early mathematical knowledge through various individual and small- and large-group activities. Building Blocks for Math embeds mathematical learning in children's daily activities, with the goal of helping children relate their informal math knowledge to more formal mathematical concepts. Al's Pals: Al's Pals is a comprehensive curriculum and teacher training program that develops social- emotional skills, self-control, problem-solving abilities, and healthy decision-making. Teachers use fun lessons, original music, and engaging puppets to help children regulate their emotions and behaviors. Teaching Strategies GOLD: This online-developmental checklist helps teachers to monitor and track students' progress in the areas of social-emotional, physical, language, cognitive, literacy, mathematics, science and technology, the arts, and English language acquisition.
